10.7.5 - ADVENTUROUS ACTIVITIES – WATER

1. **PHILOSOPHY**

- 1.1 The Water Activities program should be an integral part of all Section activities
- 1.2 For the purposes of this policy, Adventurous Activities Water are defined as any Scouting pursuits conducted in a water/ marine environment in which the participants are registered members of the Scout Association.
- 1.3 Typical pursuits include:-

Swimming	Li-lo-ing
Surfing	Canyoning
Snorkeling Scuba Diving	Rafting Canoeing Sea Kayaking Rubber Rafting (Inflatable)

Board Sailing (Wind Surfing) Sailing- Dingys/Cats) Sailing- Keel Boats

2. **OBJECTIVE**

- 2.1 The objective of this policy statement is to:
 - (a) Identify who has authority to approve and run adventurous water activities subject to the Policy 10.1 Authority and Prescribed Activities sections.
 - (b) Identify the training and competence requirements for the issue of:
 - (i) Charge Certificate to Activity Leaders Water

LEVEL 1- Basic Skills



LEVEL 2 – Advanced & Above



- (ii) Instructor Certificates to Adult Activity Leaders Water
- (iii) Charge Certificates to youth members
- (c) To provide an authoritative basis for the issue and periodic update of water activities documents providing interpretive guidelines for application of the policy, practice and safety standards.
- (d) To indicate conditions required for approval of water based expeditions (Canoe, Sail, Raft).


3. SAFE PRACTICES and DUTY OF CARE

3.1 It is widely accepted that adventure- based outdoor programs particularly water based activities, offer development opportunities for both personal growth and development and team building, but they also bring risk of accident or injury.

Without the real or imagined danger the development " opportunity" evaporates..

- 3.2 But to ensure that Leaders exercise a responsible level of duty of care, the "risk' must be managed to minimise the danger of accident or injury.
- 3.3 To do so requires good preparation and planning that takes account of three interrelated elements. They are present irrespective or whether the activity is simply a Cub Pack swim in the river or a Venturer 3 day canoe expedition.

They are:



3.4 The consideration of all three variable elements is essential in exercising duty of care judgements when planning and managing water based activities.

4. ACTIVITY APPROVAL

- 4.1 In accordance with Policy No. 10.1 the Group Leader, the Leader-in-Charge, or the Crew Leader is the person with the authority to approve water-based adventurous activities.
- 4.2 As a "Prescribed Activity", water activities require some specialist knowledge & expertise. The Group Leader or approving authority, must either demonstrate that they have the necessary specialist knowledge or competence and qualification to approve the activity or have sought advice from one of the identified sources listed below.

5. TRAINING AND COMPETENCE LEVELS

- 5.1 Full details are provided in the Water Activities Guidelines document however the following principles will apply
- 5.2 Adult Leader Definition and Qualification

5.2.1 Activity Leader - Water

- Definition An adult Leader from any Section or Rover who has completed Leader Training to the Basic level - Sectional; Senior First Aid Certificate or equivalent; and has subsequently completed the specialist training identified for the activity area.
- Certification The Certification is reviewed every three years and requires evidence of continuing activity to a minimum of 20 hours over the preceding 18 months.

Activity

Function Subject to any restrictions identified in the Guidelines, the Activity Leader may lead and/or take responsibility for youth members and other adult Leaders in planned adventurous water activities.

This may include the instruction and testing of youth members for a Charge Certificate which allows them to take charge of a single boat.

As part of their responsibility the Activity Leader may authorise and take responsibility for a water based expedition but need not personally participate.

5.2.2 Branch Activity Leader Water

Definition	 Technically qualified Leaders appointed to the Branch Water Activities Team. Qualifications include:- (i) Completion of all levels of the specialisation (eg Levels 1,2&3 – Canoeing) (ii) Minimum of 2 seasons experience; (iii) Senior First Aid Certificate; (iv) Meet the requirements as an Assistant Instructor 		
Certification	Branch Activity Leaders are required to maintain up to date knowledge in their skill area, and the certification is reviewed every 3 years.		
Activity Functions	Organise or assist in the organisation of Branch sponsored adventurous water activities; Assist with the technical training of Leaders, Rovers and Venturers as part of the Branch Water Activities training program.		
Instructors			
Definition	 Technically qualified Leaders who have: (i) Completed Leader Training to the Advanced (Wood Badge) level; (ii) Completed Trainer Training; (iii) Completed the highest level qualifications in their skill area. (iv) Assisted on several courses. 		
	 (i) Completed Leader Training to Wood Badge level; (ii) Hold current Instructor level qualifications in the specialisations in their National Association 's recognition scheme. This will also include holding an Australian Coaching Council qualification. 		
Certification	Instructors are expected to take a leading role maintaining up to date training content in the Branch Water Activity Courses. Certification will be reviewed every 3 years.		
Activity Functions	Lead specialist training of Adult Leaders, Rovers and Venturers. Lead general courses, practical training and ad hoc instruction sessions in a wide range of water safety and boating skills. Lead the organisation of Branch sponsored water activities delivered at Region or Branch level.		

5.2.3

Competency Levels for Water Activities

- 5.3.1 Greater detail is provided in the Water Activities Guidelines, but this list outlines the competence levels required for
 - (a) CHARGE CERTIFICATES where a person is authorised/accredited to take charge of a 'vessel' (youth) or a boating activity (Leaders).
 - (b) Accredited Person to lead or take charge of a Water Activity not related to boating, rafting or touring.
 - (c) Activities that do not require accreditation but are subject to the Water Activities Guidelines.

6. **ACTIVITY GUIDELINES**

6.1 The Branch Water Activities Committee under the authority of the Branch Executive Committee prepares, publishes and circulates guidelines for safe practice and standards.

These safe practices and standards are to be applied by <u>all members</u> of the Scout Association on each and every occasion they approve, lead or participate in any water based activity.

Group Leaders or others approving Adventurous Activities - Water are required to draw attention to the relevant guidelines when approving an activity which in part or wholly includes water based activities.

The Branch Water Activities Committee will constantly seek information and advice from relevant national bodies and from its own experience, to ensure that the guidelines reflect current safety standards and 'best practice'.
